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

BCHS has held ISO 14001 Environmental Management System since 2006 which is approved by NQA, a UKAS accredited company. We actively train our staff to understand their impact on the environment and implement positive changes. We encourage employees to review their work activities and identify small changes that can result in a meaningful reduction in our overall environmental impact. Additionally, we hold ISO 9001 and OHSAS 18001 soon to be ISO 45001 once our current accreditation expires in line with legislation changes.

Waste Management

BCHS works with customers and suppliers to promote waste reduction through the elimination of transit packaging. The company seeks to identify opportunities to substitute to more environmentally friendly packaging with new developments in materials. BCHS also make use of inbound packaging for outbound deliveries so few new boxes are required.

In 2020 we diverted 97% of our waste from landfill and we bale all of our plastic and cardboard waste to be recycled. We are continually looking for better ways to prevent waste from going to landfill.

As a group, Bunzl Plc makes stock donations throughout the year, which prevents retired lines from going to waste. At BCHS, these donations are made to Emmaus, where it can help to support their efforts to create supported living accommodation and training for the homeless. In 2019, we donated over £78,000 of stock to Emmaus UK which would have otherwise been thrown away.

Carbon Footprint

At BCHS, our total Scope 1 & 2 emissions have fallen by 11% since 2018.



The majority of our Scope 1 emissions come from fuel used for our commercial and company vehicles, however, this has fallen year-on-year since 2017. We are working on ways we can continue to drive emissions reductions throughout our operations, some of which are detailed on pages 12 & 13.

What is Scope 1 & Scope 2?

Scope 1

All Direct Emissions from the activities of an organisation or under their control. Including fuel combustion on-site such as gas boilers, fleet vehicles and air-conditioning leaks.

Scope 2

Indirect Emissions from electricity purchased and used by an organisation. Emissions are created during the production of the energy and eventually used by the organisation.

A Wider Impact

At BCHS, we can inform customers of the CO₂ emissions associated with their deliveries using Sustainable Solutions Carbon Forecast. With this tool, we can help customers monitor these emissions and create smarter ordering profiles to reduce them. This also enables us to show customers monthly changes in our emissions intensity.

|Water

Our use of water is primarily confined to workplace cleaning and hygiene purposes. As such, our direct water use and related emissions are minimal but we continue to install dual flush toilets in new facilities and retrofit Cistermiser and Hippo Bricks.

An area we can make a difference is through the products we offer. BCHS has a range of concentrate, soluble and chemical-free cleaning solutions that ensure water is only used when it is needed at point-of-use, rather than locked up in cleaning solutions. Examples include; Diversey Floor Pads, Cleanline Chlorine Tablets, PVA Hygiene and the Cleanline Concentrate ranges.



Fuel Consumption

Our fuel consumption has fallen 26.2% since 2011, seeing a 6.7% reduction from 2019, due to changes in customer behaviour and the use of telematics. We utilise a vehicle telematics and route optimisation system called Verizon Connect throughout our fleet to plan efficient delivery routes. BCHS works with customers to create smarter ordering profiles by minimising the number of small orders placed, which aids the reduction of CO₂ emissions associated with our deliveries. The vehicle telematics enable us to rank drivers' in order of fuel efficiency, which we then use to encourage more efficient driving through financial incentives. We have also seen an increase in fuel efficiency as a result of driver training and in-cab driving feedback to improve our drivers' driving styles and behaviour.

We regularly renew our fleet to ensure our operations continue to make use of improvements in emissions and efficiency technology. In some cases, we now use third party carriers for deliveries where it is more cost-effective, whilst continuing to invest in innovative ways we can reduce our fuel consumption. We now have two 18 tonne HGVs fitted with solar film matting to power the tail lift and in-cab comforts, which removes the need for the vehicle to be kept idling. This solar film matting could help us see a 5% improvement in fuel economy, lowering CO₂ emissions by 4 tonnes per vehicle each year. *(Figures from Trailar)*

Energy Consumption


We have seen a reduction in gas and electric consumption with a 16.2% overall reduction from 2011 to 2020. Across our branches, we have continued to implement measures that reduce electricity consumption including the installation of LED lighting with PIR sensors to minimise electricity usage where there is sufficient time left on the building lease. We also work to make sure our new branches make the most of natural light and meet higher energy efficiency standards. At branches now fitted with LEDs, we have seen a 50% reduction in electricity consumption.

We are required to report the emissions from our electricity (Scope 2, pg 10) based on the average energy mix in the UK national grid, however, we buy electricity with guaranteed origin which means we are also able to report on the actual emissions from our supplier. Our 100% renewable-sourced electricity comes from a mix of solar, wind, hydroelectric and bioenergy at 0g CO₂ per kWh!

BCHS are proud to have been able to support Emmaus throughout with numerous and continuing donations of PPE, and cleaning and hygiene supplies that were otherwise unavailable on supermarket shelves. This has meant Emmaus have been able to continue to protect their most vulnerable companions and operate their social enterprises safely.

In total, we managed to raise £12,738 in funds and donate £25,800 of stock including toilet rolls, hand towels, sanitiser, masks, gloves and hand soap for Emmaus' communities.

Emmaus communities don't just offer a bed for the night, they offer a home for as long as someone needs it, as well as meaningful work in their social enterprises. This opportunity, to become part of a community and contribute to it plays an important role in restoring self-esteem and helping Emmaus companions to find a way to overcome homelessness in the long term.

Bunzl Plc has recently launched 'Inspiring Women in Bunzl' (IWIB), which aims to be the catalyst for Bunzl to lead the way in creating a supportive and empowering culture for women to achieve their goals. 

Sustainable Solutions CarbonForecast

With Carbon Forecast, we can use your delivery data and ordering profile to calculate and project what your carbon emissions with us will be. We use our monthly gas, electric and diesel consumption in conjunction with our monthly deliveries to work out the CO₂^e emissions per delivery. We can then work with you to show you how small changes can result in big changes to carbon emissions.



Above is an example of the impact one customer can have on CO₂ emissions by reducing deliveries by 30%.

Sustainable Solutions CarbonOffset

BCHS are now able to offer our customers the opportunity to participate in Carbon Offset, to offset the emissions associated with their deliveries through verified schemes in partnership with Carbon Forecast. This makes the deliveries from our branches to their sites carbon neutral in an effort to improve the efficiency of our service and support our customers' sustainability strategies. Using Carbon Forecast, we can apportion our Scope 1 and 2 emissions to participating customers and project the impact of working together on our carbon footprint.

We already work with customers to encourage placing fewer large orders, rather than lots of small orders, which helps to reduce the emissions associated with fulfilling those orders from our branches and our fleet. However, Carbon Offset enables us to improve our operational efficiency, reducing our Scope 1 and 2 emissions, and account for emissions we are currently unable to remove by conditionally offsetting customer delivery emissions following a commitment to create smart ordering profiles and require fewer deliveries.

Sustainable Solutions Product Award

At BCHS, we have been working hard to develop the Sustainability Solutions Product Award. Built with our customers in mind, the Award is intended as a visual indicator of a product's sustainability to support sustainable decision-making and open up discussions around sustainability in the cleaning & hygiene industry.

We have defined a comprehensive set of criteria across our product categories, Chemicals, Paper, Wiping, Bags and Equipment as well as specific criteria for packaging. These criteria will be used to objectively assess the sustainability of our products against one another and fall into four scoring categories, as show across the page 26.

Sustainable Solutions Product Award

The criteria are aligned with current best practice, legal requirements and sustainability hotspots. Each product must achieve a minimum score in each category to receive a Bronze, Silver or Gold Award and every product will also receive an overall award. The Award is intended to highlight positive sustainability features with emphasis placed on recycled content, recyclability, minimal packaging, low environmental impact and responsible end-of-life. We intend to use this scoring to show customers the performance of the products they choose and align alternatives with their priorities, whether it's about plastics, non-toxic chemicals or recyclability. Going forward, we will be able to use this information to engage suppliers on how they could improve the sustainability of their products.

The Buznl Sustainability Award is intended to become a reliable source of product expertise, improve access to sustainable choices and drive positive change throughout our supply chain.

At BCHS, we understand that our customers have differing priorities. We are always on the lookout for new product innovations that will help us bring new solutions to environmental problems onto the market for all.

The biggest issues we currently face are plastics, waste, hazardous chemicals, water and responsible sourcing.



Plastic Reduction

At BCHS, we can help you reduce the amount of plastic you use by supplying measured dosage cleaning chemicals and wall-mounted dispensers. You can then reduce your waste through the purchase of fewer, larger bottles of soap or cleaning solutions rather than single-use hand pump bottles and ready-to-use (RTU) chemicals.

We supply a range of super concentrate, soluble and bulk cleaning solutions that can easily be made ready-to-use through a refillable pump and trigger spray bottles.

Some resource savings you could make include;

Alternative	Equivalent	Plastic Saving
5 litre hand soap	10 x 500ml hand-pump bottles	0.14kg
5 litre RTU chemical	6.6 x 750ml trigger spray bottles	0.4kg
1 box soluble sachets	20 x 750ml trigger spray bottles	1.25kg
5 litre super concentrate	500 x 750ml trigger spray bottles	33kg



Waste Reduction

Employing measured dosage systems will prevent chemicals from being wasted through overdosing, resulting in an RTU with more chemical than needed to do an effective job. By offering measured dosage chemicals, you can ensure that the right dose of concentrate is used every time; this can be achieved through pelican pumps, sachets, in-bottle dosage and wall-mounted measured-dose systems.

Concentrate chemicals will reduce overall packaging consumption, which has an immediate impact on your waste (see Plastic Reduction).

We are always working with suppliers to find new methods and materials for packaging to enable you to reuse and recycle a larger proportion of your cleaning supplies at the end of their useful life. This includes the launch of our reusable trigger spray bottles that are made from 100% recycling material and able to be completely recycled.

BCHS aims to support the circular economy by trying to close the loop. We are exploring ways to collaborate with suppliers and customers willing to trial closed-loop supply and have raised our expectations of suppliers, requiring them to increase the recycled content in their product packaging.



Low Hazard Chemicals

BCHS offers an expanding range of biodegradable, bacterial and enzyme-based cleaning solutions. This enables you to select chemicals that pose a minimal threat to life on land and water whilst still being highly effective in use. Many of these products use completely organic or biodegradable ingredients, giving you peace of mind to clean sites safely without the risks of hazard classifications.

We also offer floor pads that completely remove the need to use chemicals in the cleaning process and can be used with just water. They are durable, have a long lifespan and require no change to your existing cleaning routine, which ultimately reduces your waste too.



Water Saving

We are pleased to be able to bring our customers cleaning supplies that help save water across their varying cleaning needs.

BCHS supply super-concentrated chemicals and soluble cleaning tablets that reduce the amount of water locked up in the product until point-of-use. These products enable you to only use water when it is needed, keeping more of this precious resource available to those who need it. We also now offer a cleaning machine with built-in filtration, able to recycle the water used without needing to change the water for up to a week.



Responsible Sourcing

We carry out regular audits on our suppliers with the support of our Quality Assurance team based in Shanghai. The audits include checks on employees' terms and conditions of work, customer service capabilities, hygiene management systems and their policies and practices on environmental issues. We also check our suppliers against our ISO 14001:2015 standard to include how they are working to reduce the amount of non-recyclable material in their products and packaging.

Our product options include FSC accredited paper hygiene supplies, EU Ecolabel certified products and chemicals with responsibly sourced palm oil. This means you can use these products in the knowledge that they have been made from responsibly managed materials, ensuring these resources remain available to future generations.

Going forward, BCHS intend to work with our supply chain to use the Product Award to promote best-practice in material use, production and end-of-life for every product. This will improve our ability to guide our customers to make informed decisions about sustainable product purchases.
